



REFUSAL OF A VISIT VISA

Your application for a visit visa to the United Kingdom has been refused.

How your application was considered

You have applied for a visa to visit the UK.

In deciding whether you meet the requirements of Appendix V: Immigration Rules for visitors (https://www.gov.uk/government/collections/immigration-rules), I have considered:

- your application, and any additional relevant information you have provided with it
- your immigration history

The decision

I have refused your application for a visit visa because I am not satisfied that you meet the requirements of paragraph(s) V4.of Appendix V: Immigration Rules for Visitors because:

- You have applied for entry clearance to visit the UK for a period of 20 days in order to have private medical treatment at Wellington Hospital. I acknowledge that you previously visited the UK in 2010 and have taken into consideration the compassionate circumstances surrounding your application with regard to your medical condition.
- I have considered your application under paragraph V4.15 of the Immigration Rules which states that:

"The applicant must have arranged their private medical treatment before they travel to the UK, and must provide a letter from their doctor or consultant detailing:

- (a) the medical condition requiring consultation or treatment; and
- (b) the estimated costs and likely duration of any treatment which must be of a finite duration; and
- (c) where the consultation or treatment will take place."

- In support of your application you have submitted a personal letter from Dr Sirjit Singh Seyan who resides in the UK who suggests that you seek treatment with Mr James Allibone who is a consultant Spinal neurosurgeon at Wellington Hospital. However, the documents you have submitted do not demonstrate that you have arranged a consultation or treatment with Mr Allibone nor have you submitted any documentation or letter from Mr Allibone that outlines the points (a) to (c) as above as stipulated by paragraph V4.15. Your application is therefore refused under paragraph V4.15 (a) (c) of the Immigration Rules.
- Furthermore, I am aware that you have recently been granted bail in Bangladesh in order to seek medical treatment abroad and you have stated on your visa application form that you are awaiting charges of an offence committed under the Cyber Crime and Information and Communication Act of 2006. Your court case is still pending. This casts doubt on your intentions to leave the UK after the period stated by you. I am therefore not satisfied that you are a genuine visitor who will leave the UK at the end of your visit or who is genuinely seeking entry for a purpose that is permitted by the visitor route. I have therefore also refused your application in accordance with paragraph V 4.2 (a) and (c) of the Immigration Rules.

Future Applications

Any future **UK** visa applications you make will be considered on their individual merits, however you are likely to be refused unless the circumstances of your application change.
